Gather as much information as you can while on your visit!

Imagine buying a home or car without doing your research. Just seeing a picture and saying it "I'll take it!" Not a good plan!

Schedule your visit!

Colleges appreciate at least 5 days' notice before a visit. That way they can plan your visit around you and make sure YOU get the most out of the visit. Showing up unannounced puts the school at a disadvantage and decreases your chances at an enjoyable visit. Check out ANYTHING you're interested in!

Ask Questions!

Meet with an admissions counselor- talk to a student-talk to a professor-get a tour-ask how the campus is? What they like best about it? How do the scholarships work? What are the best parts of your program? What are my others options?
